BACK TO SCHOOL

Kids are back in the classroom nationwide and there's no better time than Fall to share safe travel tips with students and families

TALK BUS SAFETY WITH CHILDREN:

Your child should arrive at the bus stop at least 5 minutes before the driver is scheduled to arrive. Teach them to play it SAFE

Stay at least ten feet — five giant steps — away from the curb.

Always wait until the bus comes to a complete stop and the bus driver signals for you to board.

Face forward after finding a seat on the bus.

Exit the bus after it stops and look left-right-left for cars before crossing a street.
